Challenge

A new website was to be created for the initiative in order to appeal to the young target group. The focus here was on the mobile application of the website and, in particular, on accessibility.

Solution

The target group was analyzed in joint workshops and a concept and design were then developed for these target groups. The project was implemented with the help of **WordPress**, as it ensured that the website could be made available quickly. The site was optimized in terms of security and accessibility.
